## Lieutenant Governor Carlos Lopez-Cantera to Speak at First Coast Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Event

(November 19, 2015) – Lieutenant Governor Carlos Lopez-Cantera, the 19<sup>th</sup> Lieutenant Governor of Florida, is the guest speaker at the upcoming First Coast Hispanic Chamber of Commerce December Business Luncheon. During his 8-year term in the Legislature, he served as a member of the Governor's Property Tax Reform Committee, the My Safe Florida Home Advisory Council and the Miami-Dade County Mayor's Mortgage Fraud Task Force. He chaired the Committee on Business Regulation and the Government Affairs Committee for the Florida House of Representatives. Carlos served as Majority Whip from 2009 through 2010 and as the Majority Leader of the Florida House of Representatives during the final two years of his term from 2010 through 2012. He was elected as the Property Appraiser of Miami-Dade County in 2012.
